



Fall Discharge Information

The following information was discussed with the patient and a copy printed for him or her to take home.

Seek care immediately if you have any of the following:

- Trouble answering simple questions (What day is it? What happened to you?)
- Trouble waking up all the way
- Headache that gets worse even after taking a pain reliever
- Changes in how you act or not knowing your family or friends
- Vomiting starting one to two hours after your fall or vomiting lasting eight hours after the fall
- Different size pupils (black center of the eye)
- Stumbling or other problems with walking
- Weak-feeling arms and legs
- Double vision (seeing two of everything)
- Slurred speech
- Seizures (convulsions)
- A new or different onset of localized pain that is not relieved after taking your usual pain reliever
- If you are taking anticoagulants (blood thinners) and you have any unusual bleeding or excessive bruising of any body part that you feel may be related to your fall
